Investment Overview

To seek long-term investment growth, mainly through growth of capital, while contributing to climate change mitigation and adaptation. The Fund aims to contribute to the Paris Climate Agreement's long-term global warming target of 1.5 degrees primarily through investments in solutions to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, and secondarily through investments in companies aligning their business with this low carbon scenario. The Fund mainly invests in equities of companies that provide solutions for the mitigation and/or adaptation of climate change risk and companies which are in the process of making their business models more resilient to long-term risks presented by climate change and resource depletion.

Glossary

Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF): The Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF) includes the fees paid to the management company, the investment manager and the depository, as well as certain other expenses. The OCF is calculated by taking the relevant main material costs paid out over the 12-month period indicated and dividing them by the average net assets over the same period. The OCF does not include all expenses paid by the fund (for example, it does not include what the fund pays for buying and selling securities). It does not include any subscription charge and investors may be subject to tax on distributions. **Comparator:** Benchmark is used for comparing Fund performance, but is not a constraint to Fund Investment. **Weighted Average Market Capitalization:** A determination of a company's value, calculated by multiplying the total number of company stock shares outstanding by the price per share. For a portfolio, the value represents a weighted average based on the stocks held. **Price to Book:** The price per share of a stock divided by its book value (i.e., net worth) per share. For a portfolio, the value represents a weighted average of the stocks it holds. **Price to Earnings (12-Month Trailing)** is the share price of a stock, divided by its per-share earnings over the past year. For a portfolio, the value represents a weighted average of the stocks it holds. **Price to Cash Flow:** Supplements price/earnings ratio as a measure of relative value for a stock. For a portfolio, the value represents a weighted average of the stocks it holds. **Standard Deviation:** Measure of the degree to which a fund's return varies from the average of its previous returns. The larger the standard deviation, the greater the likelihood (and risk) that a fund's performance will fluctuate from the average return.
