#### **ESG** is integrated throughout the process

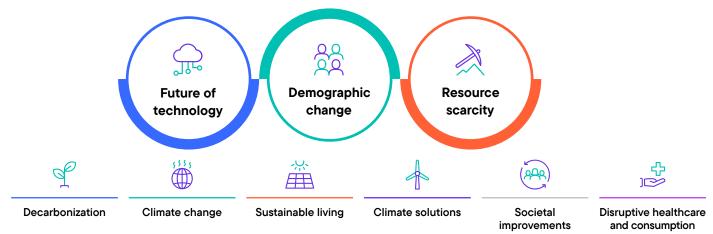
Environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors are key to the ability of a company to generate sustainable returns; analysis of these factors is fully integrated into the investment process.

- Fundamental research: Captures the complexity of the ESG risks facing a company's long-term sustainability outlook
- Engagement agenda: Builds our management engagement agenda
- Portfolio construction: Feeds into our portfolio analytics

Analysis of ESG factors is integral to the strategy, it forms part of our analysis to establish the quality and sustainability of the business.

#### Megatrends to identify long-term structural growth

We want to identify multi-decade returns so we incorporate thematic analysis into our fundamental company research. This focuses on three megatrends—demographic changes, future of technology and resource scarcity. These themes are aligned to a world transitioning towards a more sustainable future.
